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REPORT FROM THE CHAIR

This past year has seen the final celebrations of the Manitoba Arts Council's forty years of work in Manitoba. Five members of the present Board of Council were appointed in 2000, and, since that time, we have focused on building a stronger, more resilient, responsive, and accessible arts council. We have also focused

on developing and implementing various means of support to the broadest possible range of Manitobans in their practice of, and engagement with, the arts in communities throughout the province.

As evidence, I offer a summary of what we, along with our wonderfully patient and innovative staff, have accomplished over the past ten years. Manitoba has seen the Council:

- Consult with communities throughout the province in a comprehensive and hands-on process, at one time visiting more than twenty communities in a three-month period. These Listening Tours, in which Council continues to invest, provide valuable feedback about the ways in which the arts affect the lives of all Manitobans.
- Develop and deliver community-based programs that connect professional artists with other artists and the public in communities across the province.
- Develop and deliver the first Aboriginal arts programs designed specifically to support the arts practices of Aboriginal artists.
- Increase the profile and impact of arts education programs through a complete review and revision of the Artists in the Schools program; increased residencies for the program; the development of a new, integrated ArtsSmarts program that teaches curricula through the arts; a symposium for arts organizations that offer arts education programs; and a major arts education conference.
- Play an increasing role in national and international organizations dedicated to support for the arts.

We continue to place a high value on our many consultations with specific arts communities, and have undertaken and implemented several policy reviews in response to those consultations. We have worked in partnership to:

- Develop a Franco-Manitoban arts policy and refine program delivery protocols.
- Consult with a variety of ethno-cultural communities and artists.
- Develop an Equity policy to ensure fair and equal representation in all MAC's programs as well as equal opportunities at the staff and board level.
- Develop an Advocacy policy to guide Council's arts awareness and public education initiatives, while making direct submissions to the government Caucus and keeping all Members of the Legislative Assembly informed and aware of the value of the arts to Manitobans.
- Initiate and meet regularly with an Arts Advisory Panel, comprised of individuals elected by the arts community, and representing all arts disciplines as well as northern, rural, francophone and Aboriginal communities.
 - In response to the changing arts practices of our extensive, innovative, and internationally renowned arts community, the Council was able to:
- Develop a Manitoba Arts Partnership policy to meet the particular needs of Manitoba's large performing arts organizations.
- Undertake a full review of support to Manitoba's individual artists with implementation of recommendations.
- Initiate a new \$30,000 Award of Distinction to an individual to recognize their contribution to their art form and to the community.
- Develop a new partnership residency with the province of New Brunswick.

The members of Council have also been mindful of their responsibilities to the public trust, and, in the areas of governance, developed and approved a Board of Directors Assessment Policy, and approved the first set of Bylaws for Council, outlining responsibilities and processes for Council's work.

In the past eight years, the Province's allocation to the Council has grown by over \$1 million, a significant recognition by the government of the work of Council, and of the value of the arts to Manitobans, an increase for which we have been very grateful. Like all Manitobans, we have watched the arts community expand their activities, innovate, experiment, and connect with ever-increasing numbers of the public. Our own ongoing challenge, and commitment, is to provide leadership, support, and accountability to ensure that growth and success carry on for future Manitobans.

Through all these initiatives, activities, consultations, and challenges, the Council has maintained a perspective and decorum that has kept it grounded and working together. At the heart of this commitment is a belief in the efficacy of the arts as central to the development of creative, innovative, and empathetic individuals as well as a knowledgeable and critically minded citizenry.

As we move into the next decade of responsive, strategic planning and leadership, we will be building on the foundation we have established so firmly over the past ten years. We look forward to increasing interaction with Manitobans about the arts, welcoming new directions and communities, and committing to productive and innovative partnerships.

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REPORT FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The 2009/2010 Report from the Chair, Judith Flynn, highlights the ten years of extraordinary growth and change in the Council, its programs, and the Manitoba arts community.

In this, the final year of Council's four-year birthday celebration, it is important for an Executive Director to also reflect on the challenges in delivering the

changes and new directions over the past ten years. I have gone back to my introduction to a new Council in 2000 to understand where we started from in the decade and where we thought we might be going.

According to our annual report for that year, "At a Council orientation session in 2000, MAC's consultants provided a series of snapshots of the various disciplines and communities funded through MAC programs... a state of the province portrait in the year 2000." My job as Executive Director at that session was to provide another snapshot, through a different lens, to give members a sense of the impact and effectiveness of the Council's policies in the community. I hoped to provide perspective, to bring a sense of how we look in comparison to the rest of the country and the world.

After more than thirty years of work, we asked, have the Council's policies made a difference? Is the general community aware of, and affected by, the policies and programs of the Council? And does anybody care?

We established that, over the years, Council has had a major impact on this community through well-developed and crucial funding programs for artists and arts organizations. The community has been engaged and has cared. This was evident in attendance figures, in financial support from individuals and the business community, plus the extraordinary volunteer efforts of Manitobans. Manitoba had become known as a "hotbed" of arts development and creation.

When we looked at those snapshots of our arts community in the year 2000, we saw a community that was energetic

and growing, a vital and vibrant arts community in Manitoba. Manitoba was the envy of many communities across Canada and beyond, with fellow funders astounded at the level and variety of support and activity. Manitoba was considered number two in provincial per capita support for the arts, and Manitoba artists suggested that they not celebrate this fact too loudly in other cities as it might encourage migration.

However, it was a community of communities, often with little connection among one another or with artists. There was a real sense of isolation from each other and from the community at large. Partnerships and joint ventures were limited. In fact, this was regarded as one of the main weaknesses of the arts community. It could rarely provide a common front, a common face to the public. Arts organizations were seen to be battling, not just between disciplines, but also within disciplines for available resources. Issues of the adequacy of levels of funding, and the extent of public awareness of the value and quality of the arts, were particularly apparent.

This was part of the family album that required careful study. These were very complex issues that go to the heart of the reason for the subsidy of the arts in our country and province. They are core issues that must be addressed and resolved by each arts council, time and time again, given changing political and economic environments.

The Manitoba Arts Council appointed in 2000 met this challenge, and others, head-on by identifying forty-two uncompromising outcomes they wished to see in place at the end of their terms, probably not realizing that it might take up to ten years to achieve those goals. As you can see from the Chair's 2009/2010 report, Council members were up to the task, persistently addressing the needs of Manitoba artists and arts organizations, all within the context of their responsibilities to a range of Manitoba communities and available resources. The Council has been supported in this effort by fellow funders in Canada through the work of the Canadian Public Arts Funders, assisted by sister service organizations including the National Assembly of State Arts Agencies in the US and the International Federation of Arts Councils and Cultural Agencies. Their research and networking resources have made significant differences to the work here in Manitoba.

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However, after ten years of work, there still remains much to be done. The arts are not yet valued as an integral part of each community, in spite of years of relatively stable support and constant exposure. The arts are still regarded as expendable and to be set aside when other priorities surface.

The major challenges for Council in 2010 remain those of engaging the community as a whole in the conversation about the value of the arts, in acting as a catalyst in the arts community to provoke connections and communication between and about the arts community, and in celebrating the unique identity and visions of the province as defined by the arts of Manitoba. This challenge is accompanied by other parallel processes required to clarify and sustain the Council's role in the community.

The 2009/2010 Strategic Plan Report that follows in this annual report marks the final year of the current strategic plan. We will embark on a major strategic planning process in the fall of 2010 to guide the work of the Council over the next few years.

It has been an extraordinary ten-year journey with a talented and determined staff, plus funding and other partners throughout the community supporting the vision and the work of the Council.

In 2000 we summarized the actions needed to move the Council forward and they seem to have continuing resonance. In the future we see MAC:

REACHING across the real and perceived borders of our agency every day.

EMBRACING artists and arts disciplines that blur the borders and colour outside the lines.

CREATING partnerships that are crucial to our ability to serve the public.

WORKING towards successful partnerships with not-for-profit organizations, businesses, and the private sector.

DESIGNING programs with other agencies, such as Tourism and Economic Development.

BROADENING the definition of the arts and professional artists to meet the realities of Manitoba's rich cultural diversity.

STRUGGLING with globalization and technology.

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2009/2010 STRATEGIC PLAN REPORT

GOAL 1

Recognize & encourage artistic excellence, creativity, and innovation

1.1 Manitoba's professional arts sector is vibrant and innovative

- 1.1.1 MAC granting structures effectively reflect artists' practices in innovation, collaboration, and experimentation
 - ► The Special Opportunities program, which supports unique initiatives and extraordinary opportunities for individuals and organizations, maintained its previous rate of growth, indicating a significant continuing need in the community.
 - The refocused Departures program, designed to encourage experimentation and collaboration within and between artistic disciplines, grew substantially during this year.
- 1.1.2 MAC encourages interplay between Manitoba's artists and professional arts organizations
 - The Public Readings by Manitoba Writers program and the Commission and Development programs continued to serve the needs of artists and organizations.
- 1.1.3 MAC offers a broad range of programming that reflects the diversity of artistic practice in Manitoba
 - Diverse artistic practices were supported by MAC through revised publications and targeted community presentations.
 - Access programs continued to encourage and support community artists working with professionals. A new professional development program supported artists engaged in community arts practice.

1.2 Arts organizations in Manitoba are healthy and sustainable

- 1.2.1 MAC provides arts organizations with increased access to training in marketing, audience development, management, governance, and planning
 - There was continuing dialogue with organizations to determine resources required for improvement and/ or growth.
 - Travel/Professional Development grants met the needs of arts administrators for networking and professional development.

- 1.2.2 MAC provides targeted resources and opportunities that assist arts organizations of diverse size and discipline to pursue artistic excellence, creativity and innovation
 - The Management and Governance program assisted organizations to develop and refine infrastructure necessary to support artistic creation.

1.3 Individual artists have rewarding and sustainable careers

- 1.3.1 MAC provides targeted resources and opportunities that assist artists at all career stages to pursue artistic excellence
 - Eligibility requirements and program guidelines were continually refined and updated to reflect the developing arts community and new directions.
- 1.3.2 MAC delivers programs and services in a manner that is informed by the "Review of Support to Manitoba Artists"
 - The review remained a valuable resource as adjustments to programs were considered and implemented.
- 1.3.3 MAC provides resources to support a range of training and professional development in Manitoba and beyond.
 - The Travel/Professional Development program continued to meet increased demand from artists in all disciplines.
- 1.3.4 Access to MAC programs is readily available to artists in all geographic locations
 - Council and staff continued meetings and connections with communities throughout the province through in-person consultations, and presentations to artists and artistic groups and organizations.



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GOAL 2

Be a leader in the arts community and promote the value of the arts at the heart of community life

2.1 Public policy stakeholders consider the public value of the arts when making policy decisions

2.1.1 Consult with Manitobans and Manitoba communities to gain insights into what they value in the arts

- ► The Council and staff continued the "Listening Tour" project with the annual retreat held in Gimli, consultations and meetings in Thompson and Brandon, plus surrounding area, plus visits to Juried Art Shows throughout the province. Staff also maintained province-wide connections through meetings with regional and local government and community organizations.
- ► MAC Council made a presentation to the Government Caucus on the work of the Council and the state of the arts community in Manitoba.
- ► A newly elected Arts Advisory Panel with representatives from a variety of arts organizations met with Council to review issues and trends in the community.

2.2 Community support for the arts is shown through high levels of participation, attendance, volunteerism, and stewardship

2.2.1 MAC forms a pan-organizational committee of arts organization board members and volunteers

 MAC encouraged ongoing informal meetings of organizations' volunteers and professional staff.

2.2.2 Be a catalyst and a leader in developing regional, national and international partnerships

► MAC staff and board participated in Canadian Public Arts Funders' professional development and annual meetings, linking MAC's findings to a national picture of the disciplines and community. MAC staff met with cultural administrators and organizations in several other Canadian provinces to discuss arts funding models, policies, and challenges.

2.2.3 Develop proposals for Provincial Arts Policy based on our consultations

MAC continued research into the development and implementation of arts policies in Canada, the United States and around the world through membership in IFACCA.

2.3 Manitobans are aware of the important contributions that the artists and arts organizations make to our province

2.3.1 Gather and share success stories regarding how the arts has touched people's lives

 MAC gathered stories and testimonials from a wide variety of artists and organizations to support directions and vision for the arts in Manitoba. MAC developed and distributed a DVD on Manitoban artists and arts organizations.

2.3.2 Celebrate the success of our artists regionally and nationally

- ► MAC hosted the 2009 Award of Distinction Public Reception at the Winnipeg Art Gallery, honouring photographer William Eakin.
- MAC continued to inform communities about artists visiting Manitoba schools, through media releases to local media prior to visits, generating positive response and increased profile for MAC and artists.

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2.4 MAC has multi-faceted partnerships with an array of organizations to achieve its goals

2.4.1 Tailor the partnerships at an appropriate level including organizations beyond the arts community

MAC continued to liaise and build partnerships with a wide variety of community and government organizations, including recreation departments, band councils, municipal and health authorities. MAC also continued its membership in the Winnipeg Chamber of Commerce and the Manitoba Chambers of Commerce, and participated in the Winnipeg Chamber's strategic research.

2.4.2 Be a catalyst and a leader in developing regional, national and international partnerships

- ► MAC continued to be a member of the national funders' organization, the Canadian Public Arts Funders (CPAF), and continued to participate in Tri-Level Arts Funders meetings, and as a member of the Northern Working Group.
- ► MAC participated in CPAF activities and professional development meetings throughout the year.
- MAC Council and staff participated in international funders' networks, including the National Assembly of State Arts Agencies and the International Federation of Arts Councils and Cultural Agencies as well as the Americans for the Arts and Grantmakers in the Arts annual conferences.
- MAC continued to build on the Deep Bay Residency partnership with Parks Canada and Clear Lake community organizations.

GOAL 3

Encourage opportunities in the arts that reflect the cultural diversity and the Aboriginal and Franco-Manitoban identity of the province

3.1 Manitoba's professional arts sector is diverse and inclusive

3.1.1 MAC adopts francophone arts policies and communicates the integral role of francophone arts in Manitoba

Council formally approved the creation of the Franco-Manitoban Advisory Panel with a mandate to provide Council with information on community trends and needs as well as feedback on the impact of MAC programs on the community.

3.1.2 MAC adopts a First Peoples arts policy and communicates the integral role of Aboriginal arts in Manitoba

- ► MAC staff followed up the previous consultation with Aboriginal and northern communities in Bakers Narrows through participation in meetings in northern Saskatchewan hosted by the Saskatchewan Arts Board. MAC staff participated in a national symposium discussing specific needs of and for Aboriginal editors.
- A full-time Aboriginal arts consultant hired in the summer of 2008 increased MAC visibility and profile in Aboriginal communities as well as the number of applications to MAC programs, community presentations and consultations.
- Council developed a plan for an Aboriginal Arts Advisory Committee with representatives from across the Province.

3.1.3 MAC reviews its Equity policy and communicates the integral role of Manitoba's diverse artistic community

 MAC formalized the development of an Equity Committee to advise Council on direction and assessment of progress.

3.2 Artists from Manitoba's diverse communities have full access to MAC's programs in Manitoba

3.2.1 MAC supports works of excellence from a diversity of artistic practices and traditions

 MAC community access and residency programs reached a cross-section of communities and supported a wide variety of practices and traditions.

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3.2.2 MAC reviews application, consultation, and evaluation processes with a focus on diversity of artistic practice and adjusts as appropriate

 MAC continued its ongoing review and adjustments through guideline revisions. Guidelines to programs were revised to invite applicants to self-identify as members of diverse communities.

3.2.3 MAC offers equal access to information and services in both official languages

- All information was published in both official languages and service was offered in language of choice. Alliance Française was engaged to provide initial classes in conversational French for MAC staff.
- 3.2.4 MAC develops communication and consultation strategies for targeted communities to ensure awareness of MAC's programs
 - MAC consultants provided targeted presentations and workshops to several arts and cultural communities.
- 3.3 The professional arts from a range of communities and artistic practices are recognized, supported, and valued regionally, nationally, and internationally
 - 3.3.1 MAC raises profile of francophone and Aboriginal artists and organizations in Manitoba through targeted promotional initiatives
 - Targeted workshops and consultations were delivered to Aboriginal arts communities.
 - 3.3.2 MAC facilitates connections so that francophone artists have increased artistic interaction with "la francophonie" both in Canada and around the world
 - MAC supported travel and professional development opportunities for Franco-Manitoban artists.
 - 3.3.3 MAC facilitates connections so that Aboriginal artists have increased artistic interaction with First Peoples around the world
 - The Aboriginal Arts Travel/Professional Development program provided continuing opportunities for national and international connection and interaction.

GOAL 4

Support opportunities for all Manitobans to engage in and experience arts and cultural activities

- 4.1 Manitobans recognize the value of a quality arts education including high-quality arts training, experiences and involvement in a diversity of traditions and disciplines
 - 4.1.1 MAC enhances the AIS and ArtsSmarts programs ensuring diversity of geographic location and discipline in collaboration with provincial educational and cultural organizations
 - The Arts Education Manager increased focus on growth and quality of arts education program delivery with the ArtsSmarts program fully integrated into the overall arts education program.
 - The Arts Education Manager was active in developing new artist/school partnerships, professional development opportunities and participation in provincial education and cultural organizations.
 - 4.1.2 MAC recruits and encourages participation by rural artists in the AIS and ArtsSmarts programs
 - MAC developed a teaching artist mentorship pilot project with a northern community artist.
 - 4.1.3 MAC supports artists working in arts education through targeted professional development opportunities
 - ► MAC offered the fourth annual Artist in the Schools Professional Development day with focused sessions to assist artists in meeting special and unique opportunities and challenges.
 - 4.1.4 MAC supports Arts Education programs such as Artists in the Schools and ArtsSmarts to support professional artists in educational settings
 - MAC continued to advocate for artists in the schools through participation in conferences, presentations to associations and meetings, and research in arts education provincially and nationally. As part of the Listening Tours initiative, MAC visited schools and superintendents in southern and northern Manitoba, who are currently engaged in significant arts education initiatives.

- 4.2 Arts organizations play a leading role in arts education throughout the province
 - 4.2.1 MAC recognizes arts education initiatives that affect Manitobans through its operating support programs
 - MAC operating program applications required details of outreach and education programs offered by organizations.
 - 4.2.2 MAC supports professional development initiatives for those responsible for arts education within arts organizations
 - MAC continued to develop support opportunities for organizations' education coordinators.
 - 4.2.3 Arts organizations' education programming and MAC's public residency programs more effectively represent arts from a diversity of communities and traditions
 - MAC continued to monitor the level of arts education support offered to northern and rural schools through the Artist in the Schools program.
- 4.3 Manitobans have access to frequent, diverse, and high-quality arts experiences
 - 4.3.1 MAC partners with community organizations throughout the province to provide arts programming in schools and community settings
 - ► The Arts Education Manager actively recruited artists with specific backgrounds and artistic skills and knowledge to offer schools a diversity of options.
 - 4.3.2 MAC evaluates provincial arts dissemination initiatives to Manitoba communities outside of Winnipeg in the context of initiatives by other arts funders
 - MAC continued to support Contact Manitoba through the Manitoba Arts Network to connect artists in schools and communities as well as touring.

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GOAL 5

Manage resources in an effective, accountable, and transparent fashion

5.1 MAC services reflect our values of respect, integrity, consultation, and communication

5.1.1 MAC assigns appropriate human resources to deliver organizational plans

MAC restructured its management support system with refined roles and relationships to better serve the community.

5.1.2 MAC uses current technology to improve access and quality of services to clients and the public

- The new Grants Management System (AIMS) was launched at year end. The system will increase efficiencies in the delivery of programs, improve accountability, and increase access on-line for applicants across the Province.
- MAC continued as a partner in CADAC, the national financial and statistical database for arts organizations.

5.1.3 MAC has effective program development, delivery, and evaluation processes

 MAC's ongoing internal review of guidelines provided adjustments and improvements to delivery. The new AIMS system development demanded continuous assessment and evaluation of program delivery.

5.1.4 MAC has an equitable, transparent and accountable assessment process

► MAC's assessment processes were refined and adjusted through jury evaluation surveys, revised protocols, and checks and balances within the application process.

5.2 MAC is a sound steward of provincial funds

- 5.2.1 MAC aligns the management of administrative costs and the disbursement of grant funds within the context of best practice research
 - MAC's adjustments to delivery systems contributed to efficiencies and effective results.

5.2.2 MAC has clear accountability policies and procedures that are consistent with the expectations of a provincial crown agency

 MAC continued to meet all the provincial agency requirements through a thorough audit process.

5.3 MAC's staff is highly motivated, qualified, dedicated, and appropriately compensated

5.3.1 MAC attracts and retains arts funding and administrative professionals of a high calibre

Staff continued to access professional development opportunities.

5.3.2 MAC has personnel policies that reflect best practices in human resource management


Recently revised policies remained appropriate for management and personnel.

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2009 MANITOBA ARTS AWARD OF DISTINCTION RECIPIENT



William Eakin

William Eakin is the eighth recipient of the Manitoba Arts Council's Manitoba Arts Award of Distinction. This \$30,000 award is presented annually to recognize the highest level of artistic excellence and distinguished career achievements by a professional Manitoba artist.

William Eakin was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba, in 1952. He studied at the Vancouver School of Art from 1971/1974. and then at the School of the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston from 1974/1975. He has lectured at the University of Manitoba School of Fine Art and the Department of Fine Art at the University of Victoria (British Columbia). In the mid-1980s Eakin served as Fine Arts Advisor for the Sanivik Co-op in Baker Lake, Nunavut.

Over the last thirty years as a professional artist, he has received numerous awards from Manitoba Arts Council and Canada Council for the Arts, and in 1996 he was recognized with the prestigious Canada Council for the Arts Duke and Duchess of York Prize in photography. He has exhibited his photography in solo and group exhibitions across Canada. Internationally his work has been exhibited in Alaska, Minnesota, France, The Netherlands, Australia, Japan, and Taipei.

Management's Responsibility for Financial Reporting

The preparation of the financial statements and other information contained in this Annual Report is the responsibility of management of the Manitoba Arts Council.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles using management's estimates and judgments where appropriate. The financial information shown elsewhere in this Annual Report is consistent with information contained in the financial statements.

Management of the Manitoba Arts Council has developed and maintains accounting systems and internal controls designed to provide reasonable assurance of the reliability of the financial information, and that assets are appropriately accounted for and adequately safeguarded.

The financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2010 have been audited by Magnus & Buffie in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. The Auditors' Report outlines the scope of their audit and their opinion on the presentation of the information included in the financial statements.

The Council, through its Audit/Finance/Human Resource Committee, carries out its responsibility for the review and approval of the financial statements and the Annual Report. The Audit/Finance/Human Resource Committee reports to Council who approves these financial statements and the Annual Report prior to release.

Auditors' Report

We have audited the statement of financial position of Manitoba Arts Council as at March 31, 2010 and the statements of revenues and expenses and changes in fund balances for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Notes to Financial Statements

AS AT MARCH 31, 2010

1. Authority & Purpose

The Arts Council Act established the Manitoba Arts Council in 1965 to "...promote the study, enjoyment, production and performance of works in the arts." The Council is a registered charity (public foundation) and, as such, is exempt from income taxes under the Income Tax Act (Canada).

2. Change in Accounting Policies

New Accounting Policies

Section 3064 Goodwill and Intangible Assets

Effective April 1, 2009, the Council adopted the recommendations of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants ("CICA") Handbook section 3064 Goodwill and Intangible Assets and the updates to CICA Handbook section 1000 Financial Statement Concepts.

This guidance establishes updated standards for the recognition, measurement, presentation and disclosure of goodwill and intangible assets.

These changes did not have an impact on the Council's financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2010.

Credit Risk and Fair Value of Financial Assets and Financial Liabilities

During 2009 the Council adopted the Emerging Issues Committee (EIC) 173 and amendments to Section 3855, Financial Instruments - Recognition and Measurement and 3862, Financial Instruments - Disclosures:

- . Section 3855 Effective Interest Method
- . Section 3855 Embedded Derivatives on Reclassification of Financial Assets
- . Section 3855 Impairment of Financial Assets
- . Section 3862 Fair Value and Liquidity Risk Disclosure

Due to the nature of the Council's financial instruments, the adoption of these standards and amendments had no material impact on the financial statements of the Council.

3. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies and Reporting Practices

(a) Basis of Presentation

These financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles within the framework of the accounting policies summarized in these notes to the financial statements.

(b) Fund Accounting

The financial statements disclose the activities of the following funds maintained by the Council:

(i) Grants & Program Fund

This fund reflects the disbursement and administration of grants and programs in the spirit of the aims and objects of Council defined in The Arts Council Act.

(ii) Bridges Fund

This fund was established in June 1999 to generate new initiatives in art development and practice, enhance public access to the arts and enhance administrative and governance skills for arts organizations. As well, the program will encourage new partnerships, provide more opportunities for professional development and assist in audience development. The excess of revenues over expenditures, if any, is transferred to the Grants & Programs Fund at an amount determined by the Council to fulfill similar goals and objectives.

(c) Revenue Recognition

The Council follows the deferral method accounting for revenues. Externally restricted revenues are deferred and recognized as revenue in the applicable fund in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted and internally restricted revenues are recognized as revenue in the applicable fund when received or receivable.

(d) Grant Commitments

Grants and program commitments are reflected as expenses when funding is formally approved and committed by Council. Cancellations of prior years' grant expenses are reflected as rescinded grant commitments.

(e) Capital Assets

Capital assets are recorded at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is provided on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Office furniture and equipment 5-10 years Computer hardware and software 3 years

(f) Musical instruments and works of visual art

Musical instruments and works of visual art are shown on the Statement of Financial Position as assets at cost with an offsetting credit to investments in musical instruments and works of visual art. The art bank collection was re-appraised in 2005, at a current market value of \$449,222.00.

(g) Capital Disclosures

The Council's capital consists of Fund balances. The Council's capital management policy is to maintain sufficient capital to meet its objectives through its fund balances by managing its grants and operational expenses against its funding revenue. There were no changes in the Council's approach to capital management during the period.

The Council is not subject to externally imposed capital requirements.

(h) Financial Instruments - recognition and measurement

Financial assets and liabilities are initially recorded at fair value. Measurement in subsequent periods depends on the financial instrument's classification. Financial instruments are classified into one of the following five categories: held for trading; available for sale; held to maturity; loans and receivables; and other financial liabilities. All financial instruments classified as held for trading or available for sale are subsequently measured at fair value with any change in fair value recorded in net earnings and other comprehensive income, respectively. All other financial instruments are subsequently measured at amortized cost.

Gains and losses on financial instruments subsequently measured at amortized cost are recognized in the statement revenues and expenses and fund balances in the period the gain or loss occurs. Changes in the fair value on financial instruments classified as held for trading are recognized in the statement of revenues and expenses and fund balances for the current period. Changes in fair value on financial instruments classified as available for sale would be recorded in other comprehensive income until realized, at which time they are recorded in the combined statement of revenues, expenses and comprehensive income and fund balances.

(i) Fair Value of Financial Instruments

The fair value of cash and short-term investments, accrued interest income, accounts receivable, long term investments, accounts payable and accrued liabilities and commitments for grants and programs approximate their carrying values due to their short-term maturity.

The fair value of the recoverable, Province of Manitoba is not practical to determine due to their underlying terms and conditions.

(j) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of certain assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of certain revenue and expenses during the year. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

4. Cash and short term investments

Cash and short term investments consist of \$69,041 cash (2009 - \$30,601) and a short term investment of \$30,059 (2009 - \$287,362). The short term investment matures June 21, 2010 with a yield of 0.15 %.

7. Works of Visual Art

The Manitoba Arts Council moved selected works from the Visual Art Bank to the Art Gallery of Southwestern Manitoba. The Manitoba Foundation for the Arts awarded a grant to the Manitoba Arts Council to provide to the Art Gallery of Southwestern Manitoba for the care, storage and exhibition of those works. An art bank loan agreement between the Council and the Art Gallery of Southwestern Manitoba is currently being negotiated.

8. Interfund Transfers and Internally Restricted Fund Balances

In 2010, the Council members internally restricted \$40,000 to be used as follows:

These internally restricted amounts are not available for unrestricted purposes without the approval of the members of Council. In addition, \$457,626 (2009 - \$409,872) was transferred from the Bridges Fund to the Grants & Programs Fund in order to fund the cash outlays for Grants to Individual Artists and Arts Development Grants.

9. Lease Commitment

Council has entered into an agreement to lease office premises until March 31, 2012. The 2010 basic annual rent was \$113,684. The 2011 basic annual rent is estimated to be the same as 2010 (\$113,684). Expenses arising from an escalation clause for taxes, insurance, utilities and building maintenance are in addition to the basic rent.

10. Funding Agreement

The funding agreement with the Province of Manitoba established the terms and conditions of funding for five years ended March 31, 2000. During the term of the agreement, Council was entitled to retain proceeds up to \$1,000,000 from the Province of Manitoba. Any proceeds retained in excess of \$1,000,000 except for proceeds exempted in the funding agreement, would have been repaid to the Province of Manitoba on demand. In accordance with this agreement, there were no proceeds repayable to the Province. As at March 31, 2010, the Council was in discussions with the Province regarding the terms of a new funding agreement.

11. Pension Plan

Eligible employees are participants in the Manitoba Civil Service Superannuation Fund. The Council participates on a fully funded basis and its contributions of \$24,841 (2009 - \$13,257) represent the total obligations for the year.

12. Severance Liability

Effective March 31, 1999, the Manitoba Arts Council, as a Crown organization, is required to record a severance liability. The Province of Manitoba has recognized an opening liability of \$36,000 as at April 1, 1998. Any subsequent changes to the severance liability will be the responsibility of Council. As at March 31, 2010, Council recorded a liability of \$27,719 (2009 - \$34,706). This liability is included in accounts payable and accrued liabilities.

13. Statement of Cash Flow

A statement of cash flow is not presented as part of the financial statements as Council has determined that cash flow information is readily determinable from the other financial statements.

14. Economic Dependence

A substantial portion of the Council's total revenue is derived from the Province of Manitoba in the form of an operating grant.

15. Financial Instruments - Risk Management

In the normal course of operations the Council is exposed to various financial risks. The financial risk management objectives and policies are as follows:

Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument fails to discharge an obligation and causes financial loss to another party. Financial instruments which potentially subject the Council to credit risk consist principally of cash and short-term investments, accrued interest income, accounts receivable and long term investments.

Cash and short-term investments and accrued interest income: The Council is not exposed to significant credit risk as these are primarily held by financial institutions and the Province of Manitoba.

Long term investments: The Council is not exposed to significant credit risk as these consist of interest bearing bonds and accounts from financial institutions and Manitoba Hydro, a provincial Crown corporation.

Accounts receivable: The Council is not exposed to significant credit risk as the nature of the accounts receivable is with the Province of Manitoba.

Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Council will not be able to meet its financial obligations as they come due.

Management monitors the Council's liquidity and is of the opinion that it is unlikely that the Council will encounter difficulty in raising funds to meet commitments associated with financial instruments.

Market risk

Market risk is the risk that changes in market prices, such as interest rates and foreign exchange rates, will affect the Council's income or the fair values of its financial instruments. The significant market risks the Council is exposed to is interest rate risk.

Interest rate risk

Interest rate risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market interest rates. The interest rate exposure relates to short-term investments and long term investments.

The interest rate risk on short-term investments are considered to be low because of their short-term nature.

The interest rate risk on long term investments are considered to be low because this consists mainly of fixed interest bearing bonds.
